NEWS TO USE FROM CARNIVAL CRUISE LINES

MIAMI – From a host of new itineraries, including the line’s first-ever Greek Isles voyages and the first year-round cruises from San Diego, to fleetwide cell phone and wireless Internet access, Carnival Cruise Lines has a number of exciting developments on tap for the coming year:

First-Ever Greek Isles Cruises Aboard Carnival Freedom – For its inaugural 2007 season, the new 2,974-passenger Carnival Freedom will operate an exciting schedule that includes the line’s first Greek Isles cruises as well as the continuation of Carnival’s popular Grand Mediterranean program. The 12-day Greek Isles/Mediterranean and Grand Mediterranean cruises will operate round-trip from Rome (Civitavecchia) March 14 - Oct. 16, 2007.

First Year-Round Cruise Schedule from San Diego – Beginning June 2, 2007, Carnival’s 2,052-passenger Elation will launch San Diego’s first year-round cruise program with four- and five-day voyages to Baja Mexico. On this one-of-a-kind program, four-day cruises will visit Cabo San Lucas while five-day voyages will add a stop in Ensenada.

Fleetwide Cell Phone Service – Through an exclusive agreement between Carnival and Wireless Maritime Services, a joint venture of Cingular Wireless and Maritime Telecommunications Network, guests sailing aboard all 21 “Fun Ships” can now enjoy a new communications option that allows them to stay in touch with people back home using their personal cell phones while in port or at sea.

Fleetwide Wi-Fi Internet Access – Carnival has expanded wireless Internet access to all public rooms aboard all 22 “Fun Ships.” With the installation of strategically located Wi-Fi “hot spots,” guests can now access Web sites and send e-mails via any wireless-equipped laptop computer from all lounges, bars, pool areas, open decks, dining venues and suite accommodations.

New Itinerary for Imagination – The tropical destinations of Half Moon Cay, Grand Turk and Nassau will be featured on an exciting new three-port, five-day itinerary of the 2,052-passenger Imagination. The new itinerary, which begins Monday, August 13, 2007, is the latest enhancement to the ship's popular year-round four- and five-day cruise schedule from Miami. The program also includes four-day cruises departing Thursdays calling at Key West and Calica and five-day cruises departing Saturdays visiting Grand Cayman and Ocho Rios.

New 130,000-ton SuperLiners Named – “Carnival Dream” and “Carnival Magic” are the names chosen for Carnival Cruise Lines' new 130,000-ton SuperLiners scheduled to enter service in October 2009 and June 2011, respectively. The new 3,652-passenger vessels – to be the largest in the Carnival fleet – will offer the most spacious design of any “Fun Ship” as well as a host of new and expanded features.

New ‘Water Wars’ Water Balloon Attraction – Carnival is the first cruise line to feature the popular “Water Wars” water balloon attraction, currently found in amusement parks in 22 countries throughout the world. The attraction features two “battle stations” in which participants propel water balloons through the air via catapults in an effort to splash their competitors. “Water Wars” will be installed fleetwide by summer 2007.

New Homeports for Carnival Legend, Carnival Miracle – Carnival is switching the homeport deployments of the 2,124-passenger Carnival Legend and Carnival Miracle beginning in spring 2007. Carnival Legend, which currently sails from Fort Lauderdale and New York, will be deployed to Tampa to launch seven-day western Caribbean voyages from that port beginning April 15, 2007. Currently based in Tampa, Carnival Miracle will be relocated to New York and Fort Lauderdale to operate eight-day Caribbean cruises from those ports beginning April 25, 2007.

Imagination, Inspiration Refurbishments – As part of an ongoing initiative to continually renew the interiors of its existing vessels, the Imagination and Inspiration will each undergo extensive renovations this year. Following the multi-million-dollar makeovers, the two 2,052-passenger SuperLiners will each feature expansive new children and teen facilities, a nine-hole miniature golf course, an updated health and fitness center, new photo and art galleries, renovated staterooms and suites, a patisserie serving specialty coffees and sweets, and a host of technical enhancements.

Carnival is the largest and most popular cruise line in the world, with 22 "Fun Ships" operating voyages ranging from three to 16 days in length to the Bahamas, Caribbean, Mexico, Alaska, Hawaii, New England, Canada, Bermuda, Europe and the Greek Isles. The line currently has four new ships scheduled to enter service between now and 2011.
